COVID-19 UPDATES

Locations and max enrollment are subject to change, as school needs and guidance changes.

Registration/Groups:

Parents will be able to register their children for individual days. Separate groups will be created based on the registration each day. Daily groups are to remain separate each day with no mixing of children and/or staff. One lead staff member is allowed to “float” between groups as needed.

Child Drop-Off and Pickup:

Parents will use the Park District main entrance to pickup and drop off their children. At no time will parents/guardians be allowed to enter the designated childcare room(s).

Drop-off (Full Day Fun Zones Only):

For morning/before school childcare (6am-7:50am) and full day fun zones, parents should notify the front desk of who they are dropping off and a staff member will meet your child to escort them to the daycare room. For after school/evening childcare and half-day fun zones, staff will pick children up from school and escort them to the daycare rooms.

Pickup:

From their vehicle, parents will notify the front desk by calling 815-234-8435 who they are here to pick up. The front desk will then contact Tiger Den staff via mobile radio. Staff will then bring the child to the parent.

Cleaning:

High touch areas will be cleaned at a minimum every two hours. Staff will complete the high touch area cleaning log each day and turn it in to their immediate supervisor.

If Covid-19 Symptoms are present:

Any child or staff member suspected of having COVID-19 or diagnosed with COVID-19 shall be excluded from the facility.

Symptoms of COVID-19 are fever (temperature greater than 100.4F/37C), chills, sore throat, runny nose, cough, shortness of breath, muscle aches, headache, vomiting and diarrhea.

If the child or staff member is diagnosed with COVID-19, he or she is not to return to the childcare facility until ALL three of the following are met:

1. Individual is free from fever without the use of fever-reducing medications for at least 72 hours.
2. Individual's symptoms, including cough, have improved.
3. It has been at least 10 days since the onset of the individual's illness.

If the child or staff member has symptoms of COVID-19 and it is subsequently determined by a medical provider that the individual likely does not have a COVID-19 infection, the child or staff member can return to day care if the following is met:

1. No fever for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medications (fever is temperature greater than 100.4F/37C)
2. Negative test for COVID-19 or a note from a medical provider documenting no clinical suspicion of COVID-19 infection.

Any child or staff with close contact (within 6 feet for greater than 15 minutes) to a person suspected or diagnosed with COVID-19 be excluded from the day care facility for 14 days and monitored for symptoms. If symptoms develop, they are encouraged to be evaluated and tested for COVID-19.

Parents will be informed via automated call regarding any Covid-19 cases within the daycare facility.

Families are expected to immediately notify the Byron Park District if someone in their home tests positive or if the child has been in close contact (within 6 feet for greater than 15 minutes) with a positive case.

Face Coverings:

Face coverings are required for all program staff as well as any child over the age of two.

Face coverings are not to be worn while children are eating or drinking.

Face coverings need not be worn while engaging in active outdoor play as long as children are able to keep physical distance from others.
